"Lenny Bruce's Tattoo: The Body in Stand-Up Comedy"

Keynote by Oliver Double

Stand-up comedy has often been regarded as a primarily verbal form, but in fact, the body plays a central role in it. The emphasis on verbal aspects – and material over performance – means that the physical elements of stand-up performance have been underexamined.

Stand-up comedian Oliver Double explores the two key roles that the body plays in stand-up. Firstly, he examines how comedians use their bodies as a defining feature of their onstage identity and a tool for establishing a relationship with the audience. Comedians play on their own inherent physical properties, allowing them to address physical difference, disability, illness and stereotyping. Secondly, the keynote identifies the different physical performance strategies that comedians use, including presenting the body as a funny object, slapstick, and act-outs. It concludes by showing how Lenny Bruce's routine about his tattoo exemplifies the political meanings of the body in stand-up comedy.

This keynote is part of the conference <u>Materiality Matters: Figurations of Comic Bodies</u> <u>and Things</u>, which explores the mediating function of materialities with regard to comic effects. The conference is organized by the research network <u>Comic Literacies</u> – Kulturtechniken des Komischen.
